Y1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Changes within living memory and ,where appropriate, these should be used to reveal aspects of change in national life to include a study of : houses, transport, schools</li><li>• Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally eg: first aeroplane flight, festivals or anniversaries.</li></ul>
Y2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A study of the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements. Some should be used to <b>compare</b> aspects of life in different periods.</li><li>• Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally eg The Great Fire of London, Remembrance Sunday</li><li>• Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality.</li></ul>
Y3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Changes in Britain from the Stone age to the Iron Age</li><li>• Ancient Egypt</li><li>• A Local History Study</li></ul>
Y4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The Roman Empire &amp; its impact on Britain</li><li>• Britain's settlement by Anglo-Saxons and Sots.</li><li>• The Viking &amp; Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor</li></ul>
Y5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Ancient Greece</li><li>• Local History</li><li>• A significant turning point in British History</li></ul>
Y6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A Non-European society that provides a contrast with British History - Early Islamic civilization, including a study of Baghdad,</li><li>• A study of an aspect or theme in British history that extends pupils' chronological knowledge beyond 1066 - Leisure and entertainment in the 20th century.</li></ul>
