



**Pupil Premium – Planned Spend 2019/ 2020
Initial Plan September 2019**

At Healey Foundation Primary School we continue to ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils. We identify those in vulnerable groups, those eligible for free school meals and looked after children. At Healey we also include other vulnerable children who need additional support in order to learn. We recognise that not all pupils who are vulnerable are registered, or qualify for, free school meals.

Speech and language therapist – 1 day per week	£8,854	All Reception children were screened in the Autumn Term, 5 of these were pupil premium. 5 disadvantaged children accessed interventions led by the therapist
Guided Reading Support in KS2 (Teacher - 1 morning)	£4,708	67% of disadvantaged children were at the expected level in Reading at the end of KS 2
HLTA – SENCo support (2 hours)	£1,685	This spending provided support for the 10 pupil premium children who are also on the SEN register.
Before and After School Club Support	£1,500	Two pupils have benefitted regularly from this support.
SEN and Social Interventions – 15 hours (HLTA)	£12,634	33 pupil premium children accessed these interventions at some point in the year.
KS 1 interventions 2 hours (TA 3)	£1,426	All pupils on intervention made progress due to additional support.
Additional support in EYFS (TA 2) – 15 hours	£9,129	5 disadvantaged pupils were supported by this.

Forest schools intervention with vulnerable groups – 2 afternoons	£2,426	12 pupil premium children accessed this intervention
Addition support in Year 1- TA 2 15 hours	£7,279	This additional support enabled greater independence and strengthened reading within Y1.
Early opening of Year 6 (TA 3) Spring Term	£1,070	7 pupil premium children accessed this intervention – strengthening the pupils ability to reach the expected standard.
2 extra Educational Psychology visits	£1,040	6 pupil premium child accessed this.
New starter packs - Reception	£200	New starter packs are given to families on the home visit; this is a Healey Reading Book Bag which contains a colouring book, pencils, crayons and scissors.
Home visits for new intake (Early Help) Supply cover for teacher and SENCo.	£1,500	These visits are part of the Early Help support for families. They enable school to know families a bit more and offer appropriate help and support early on.
'Alternative' curriculum group KS 1 (TA 3) 4 afternoons	£6,417	7 children accessed this – enabling pupils to access primary education and focus their learning behaviours in a morning.
'Alternative' curriculum group KS 2 (TA 3) 4 afternoons	£6,417	7 children accessed this – enabling pupils to access primary education and focus their learning behaviours in a morning.
Lunchtime Club TA 2 x 2 5 hours	£2,830	Children with social and emotional difficulties found lunchtimes easier due to having access to this provision.
Robinwood contribution	£500	1 pupil premium pupil was funded for this trip.
Headteacher's discretionary support	£1,000	This discretionary support is confidential.
